2. Submit reports and updates as required to the Arkansas Department of Education in regard to the use of the ARRA funds.
3. Ensure all construction projects receive a full review and vetting to meet federal laws and regulations and state law.
4. Ensure all construction projects are entered and certified into the Computerized Maintenance Management System ("School Dude").
5. Ensure expenditures are coded correctly and recovery funds are tracked separately from regular local, state or other federal funds.
6. Cooperate fully with any Comptroller General, Inspector General, State Auditor and/or Monitor in the evaluation of the uses of the ARRA.
7. Comply with all applicable assurances in OMB Standard Forms 424B and D (Assurances for Non-Construction and Construction Programs), including the assurances relating to the legal authority to apply for assistance; access to records; conflict of interest; merit systems; nondiscrimination; Hatch Act provisions; labor standards; flood hazards; historic preservation; protection of human subjects; animal welfare; lead-based paint; Single Audit Act; and the general agreement to comply with all applicable Federal laws, executive orders and regulations.

Ensure that ARRA funds received are not used to pay any person to influence or attempt to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the making or renewal of Federal grants under this program.
